## ITINERARY

### **Day 1: CAIRO| Arrive Cairo.**

#### **Meals Included: No Meals.**

#### **Meet and Greet at Cairo Airport.**

To ensure your journey is seamless from the start, our representative will meet you before passport control to take care of stamping visa, passport control and luggage collecting.

Later you will be transferred to your hotel and check-in.

Dinner on your own.

Overnight in Cairo.

### **Day 2: CAIRO| Sakkara / Memphis / Pyramids of Giza / Sphinx / Camel Ride / Entry Great Pyramid.**

#### **Meals Included: Breakfast.**

Buffet breakfast at hotel.

Meet your guide at the lobby to begin the day by visiting **Saqqara**, the ancient burial site. On the site, which is considered by many archaeologists to be one of the world's most important excavations, is the Step Pyramid, which was constructed by Imhotep in the 27th century BC. The pyramid is part of the tomb complex of Zoser, who was the first Pharaoh of the Old Kingdom. The pyramid began as a simple Mastaba, or long, flat tomb building.

Continue to **Memphis**, which was the capital of Egypt during the Old Kingdom (ca 2700-2180 BC). At the ancient city of Memphis, we will see several statues in a garden-like setting.

Free time for lunch "Lunch on you own".

Continue to **Giza Plateau** with the famous **Great Pyramid** and **Sphinx**. Dominating the plateau and running in a southwest diagonal through the site are the three pyramids of the pharaohs **Khufu**, **Khafra**, and **Menkaura**. The northernmost, and the largest, one belongs to Khufu. **Khafra's pyramid** is built precisely on a southwest diagonal to his father's pyramid, as well as having been built on higher ground to create the illusion of being bigger. The pyramid of **Menkaura** is much smaller and is not aligned along the same diagonal line as the other two pyramids. **The Sphinx** is the largest monolith statue in the world and it is the oldest known monumental sculpture.

You will have the opportunity to **Entry the Great Pyramid** and finishing pyramids tour with a **Camel ride** through the desert.

Return to hotel and enjoy the remainder of the evening at your leisure.

Dinner on your own.

Overnight in Cairo.

### **Day 3: CAIRO| Grand Egyptian Museum / National Museum of Egyptian Civilization.**

#### **Meals Included: Breakfast.**

Buffet breakfast at hotel.

Meet your guide at the lobby to begin the day by visiting **The Grand Egyptian Museum** holds in trust for Egypt and the World a chronological statement for the ancient history of Egypt over the past 7000 years. Neighboring a timeless wonder,

the Giza Pyramids, the new museum is to pay homage to eternal Ancient Egyptian monuments, treasures, and history hosting over 100,000 artifacts, about 3500 of which belong to the famous King Tutankhamen.

The site chosen for the GEM is only 2km from the legendary Pyramids. Nested between the ancient Great Pyramids and the modern city of Cairo, at the junction between dry desert and the fertile floodplain, the Grand Museum is a portal to the past. The Giza plateau Memphis and its Necropolis nominated by UNESCO among the world Cultural Heritage Sites, contains irreplaceable monuments from across time. The museum complex will be built on a plot of land approximately 117 feddans, about 480,000 square meters.

Free time for lunch "Lunch on you own".

Proceed to the **National Museum of Civilization**, the first veritable museum of civilization in Egypt, the NMEC is located on the archaeological site of El-Fustat in Old Cairo, overlooking the Ain El-Seera Lake. The Museum was designed by Egyptian architect El Ghazzali Kosseiba. The exhibition spaces are being designed by Japanese architect Arata Isozaki. The NMEC will showcase Egyptian civilization from prehistoric times to the present day, using a multidisciplinary approach that highlights the country's tangible and intangible heritage.

Return to hotel and enjoy the remainder of the evening at your leisure.

Dinner on your own.

Overnight in Cairo.

### **Day 4: CAIRO| Egyptian Museum / Citadel / Coptic Cairo / Khan EL Khalili / Walking on El Moaz Street.**

#### **Meals Included: Breakfast.**

Buffet breakfast at the hotel.

Meet your guide at the lobby and head to the famous **Egyptian Museum** where you can see the unique and only collection of Pharaonic art, starting with the Old

Kingdom Collection, on to the Middle and New Kingdom galleries and Greco-Roman periods. The museum contains the world's most extensive collection of pharaonic antiquities; no visit to Egypt is complete without a trip through its galleries.

Continue to **Coptic Cairo**, were you will visit **Hanging Church**, dating to the late 4th and early 5th Century, this basilica was named "Al-Mu'allaqah" because it was built on top of the south gate of the Fortress of Babylon. Then to **Church of St. Sergius**, dating back to the beginning of the 5th Century, this basilica is built on the cave in which the Holy Family stayed and is regarded by visitors as a source of blessing.

Heading to the recently restored **Synagogue of Ben Ezra**– the oldest Jewish synagogue in Egypt. Despite the 45 Jewish families that remain in Cairo, the synagogue is no longer operational.

Drive to Mokattam Hill where old fortress built by Salah El Din Al Ayoubi, you will see **The Citadel** Encompasses the **Mosque of Mohamed Ali**.

Continue to **El Moaz Street**, which is an open-air Museum. It is one of the most amazing streets in Islamic Cairo; it dates back to the Fatimid era and has almost all types of Islamic architecture decorated with Arabic calligraphy.

Free time for lunch “Lunch on your own”

Finishing the tour with the fascinating **Khan El-Khalili Bazaar** – reputed to be the largest bazaar in the Middle East. Originally founded as a watering stop for caravanserai in the 14th century, the bazaar has now grown to vast proportions. As you wander through the labyrinth of narrow streets, you will find workshops and stalls selling all manner of things from woodwork, glassware and leather goods to perfumes, fabrics and Pharaonic curiosities.

Return to hotel and enjoy the remainder of the evening at your leisure.

Dinner on your own.

Overnight in Cairo.

#### **Day 5: ABU SIMBEL | Fly to Abu Simbel / Abu Simbel Temple / Sound & Light.**

**Meals Included: Breakfast / Lunch / Dinner.**

Buffet breakfast at hotel.

Meet our representative at the lobby.

Transfer to Cairo Airport for your domestic flight to Abu Simbel via Aswan; our representative will help you with all the departure procedures on Cairo & arrival procedures on Abu Simbel.

Meet our representative for your private transfer to Lake cruise for check-in.

**12:00 noon** Embarkation.

**13:30** Lunch on board.

**14:00** Visit Abu Simbel Temple - you will be transferred to visit the great Temple hewn in rock with the four colossal seated status of the King in front of the entrance. It was dedicated to Amun-Ra, the Horakkhti, and Ramses II. Then visit the king’s wife, Nefertari. This temple was threatened by the waters upon the completion of the Aswan High Dam and has been preserved by international action organized by UNESCO. All parts of the temple (status, inscribed slabs, etc.) have been rebuilt on a plateau above the former site.

**16:00** Tea Time.

**20:00** Optional Visit to Sound & Light Show.

**21:00** Dinner on Board.

Overnight in Abu Simbel.

**Day 6: LAKE CRUISE| Kasr Ibrim / Amada / Tomb of Pennut.**

**Meals Included: Breakfast / Lunch / Dinner.**

Sail to Kasr Ibrim.

**11:30** Over View **Kasr Ibrim** (15 Minutes for photos only From Sundeck) Qasr Ibrim is an archaeological site in Lower Nubia. It was named after an ancient citadel on Lake Nasser. Uncover Qasr Ibrim between Egypt and Africa facts, History of Qasr Ibrim Temple, Cathedral Plan and What to See in The Citadel of Kasr Ibrim Egypt.

**16:30** Visit **Amada** the **Amada Temple** is the oldest temple ever discovered in Nubia, and even though it's been altered a number of times throughout history, and even completely relocated, it is still a fascinating place to visit, particularly if you're going to be enjoying a Lake Nasser cruise while you're in the country.

The **tomb of Pennut** dates to the Twentieth Dynasty, and specifically to the reign of Ramses VI ( $\pm$  1143-1136 BC.): the cartouches of the Pharaoh are carved on the walls of the chapel (see rb-0623/01). It is now on the shore of Lake Nasser, on the site of the new Amada. Pennut was chief priest of the temple of Horus of Aniba (ancient Miam), where his wife was a singer. The chapel consists of a rectangular room with a niche that contained three statues. The burial shaft, which descended from the middle of the room, remained behind during the moving of the monument.

**18:30** Sail to Wadi El Seboua.

**19:15** Cocktail Party (Head Departments Presentation).

**21:30** Nubian Show (by the Staff).

Overnight at Wadi El Seboua.

**Day 7: LAKE CRUISE| Temple of wadi El Seboua.**

**Meals Included: Breakfast / Lunch / Dinner.**

Visit **Wadi El Seboua Temples**. It names in Arabic means "Valley of the Lions", referring to the avenue of sphinxes that leads up to this temple, which was built during the reign of Ramesses II. Though it was moved to its current location only in the 1960's, it was quickly neglected.

By the time it became a frequent tourist attraction again in the 1990's when cruises started running on Lake Nasser, it was partially filled with sand. The effect of its unkempt appearance and remote location is to give visitors the feeling that they are themselves discovering this temple for the first time.

**09:00** Sail to Aswan.

Overnight in Aswan.

**Day 8: LAKE CRUISE| Kalabsha Temple / Nubian Museum.**

**Meals Included: Breakfast.**

Buffet breakfast on board.

**08:00 AM** Disembarkation after breakfast.

Visit **Kalabsha Temple** which is located within view of the High Dam. **Kalabsha Temple** is often the first stop for any cruise on Lake Nasser. It was moved to this spot from its originally location 30 miles to the south after the construction of the dam.

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Construction of the temple was begun at the end of the Ptolomaic Dynasty and actually completed under the rule of the Roman Emperor Augustus. The result is an interesting combination of imagery that includes Egyptian and Roman themes with images of Roman emperors and pharaohs worshipping with the Egyptian gods. The temple was dedicated to the Nubian god Mandulis.

Meet our representative for your private transfer to your hotel for check-in.  
Free time for lunch "on your own".

Meet your guide and head to the **Nubian Museum**, which is the first museum exposing the rich Nubian culture. The museum features Nubian artifacts, weapons, pottery, utensils, paintings, and sculptures.

Return to hotel and enjoy the remainder of the evening at your leisure.  
Dinner on your own. Overnight in Aswan.

### **Day 9: ASWAN| Philae Temple / High Dam / Unfinished Obelisk / Felucca Ride.**

#### **Meals Included: Breakfast.**

Buffet breakfast on hotel.

Meet your guide at the lobby, proceed to the docks on Lake Nasser for a short boat ride to the island of **Philae** where you will visit the beautiful **Temple of Isis**. Dedicated for the world's most Famous Goddess Isis and also represents three great civilizations - Egyptian, Greek and Roman.

Then to the **High Dam**, drive over the Old Aswan Barrage, constructed in the 1920's over the Nile's 1st cataract. You will arrive at the site of the Aswan High Dam; one of the largest rock-filled dams in the world and considered as a great achievement of modern construction.

From the top of the dam, you will look out at Lake Nasser, the largest artificial Lake in the world.

Continue to the **Unfinished Obelisk**, which is the largest known ancient obelisk and is located in the northern region of the stone quarries of ancient Egypt in Aswan.

Free time for lunch "on your own".

Afternoon you will board a typical Egyptian "**felucca**" which will sail you on the blue waters of the mighty Nile, among the lovely small islands of Aswan, and around the Elephantine.

Return to hotel and enjoy the remainder of the evening at your leisure.  
Dinner on your own. Overnight in Aswan.



**Day 10: LUXOR| Drive to Luxor / Temple of Kom Ombo / Temples of Edfu.**

**Meals Included: Breakfast / Lunch "Box Lunch".**

Buffet breakfast at hotel.

Check out after breakfast.

Meet your guide at the lobby for your private transfer to Luxor from Aswan; visit **Edfu Temple & Kom Ombo** Temple en route.

**Twin Temple of Kom Ombo.** It is dedicated to the hawk-headed god, Harwar and the crocodile god, Sobek. 40 km north of Aswan and 70 km south of Edfu is the Temple of Kom Ombo, also known as the dual temple of Sobek and Haroeris. "Duel" because everything is doubled in this perfectly symmetrical temple. Twin entrances, twin halls, twin colonnades, etc. The Greco-Roman temple is directly on the banks of the Nile.

Free time for lunch "Lunch box included".

**Temple of Edfu,** Temple of falcon-headed, Horus "One of the finest examples of Ptolemaic art in Egypt. You will be transferred to the temple by Caleche. The city of Edfu lies half way between Luxor and Aswan on the site of the ancient city of Djeba. Located 100 km south of Luxor, and 53 km south of Esna, it is home to the best-preserved and largest Greco-Roman temple in Egypt, the Temple of Horus.

Upon arrival in Luxor, you will be transferred to your hotel for check-in.

Enjoy the remainder of the evening at your leisure.  
Dinner on your own.

Overnight in Luxor.

**Day 11: LUXOR| Karnak Temple / Luxor Temple.**

**Meals Included: Breakfast.**

Buffet breakfast at hotel.

Meet your representative at the lobby.

Transfer to Cairo Airport for your domestic flight to Luxor; our representative will help you with all the departure procedures on Cairo & arrival procedures on Luxor.

Upon arrival in Luxor, you will be transferred to your hotel for check-in.

Free time for lunch "on your own".

Meet your guide at the lobby, go ahead to the East bank, visit **Karnak Temple.** Walk along the Avenue of Sphinx to enter the complex as your guide explains how the massive facade was constructed. On entering the Temples of Karnak, you will see each legacy left by the various pharaohs as the complex grew even larger. The deeper you go into the complex, the further back in time you will travel, with the oldest ruins dating back over 3,000 years.

Continue to **Luxor Temple,** which was once joined to the Temples of Karnak by a two-kilometer-long Avenue of Sphinx, a portion of which marks the entrance to the temple.

Dominated by statues of the great warrior pharaoh Ramses II, Luxor Temple has survived Nile floods, foreign invasion and thousands of years exposed to the elements.

Enjoy the remainder of the evening at your leisure.  
Dinner on your own.

Overnight in Luxor.

### **Day 12: LUXOR| Valley of Kings & Queens / Hatshepsut Temple / Colossi of Memnon.**

#### **Meals Included: Breakfast.**

Buffet breakfast at hotel.

Meet your guide at the lobby for your private tour to the West Bank: Valley of the Kings & Queens, Hatshepsut (El-Deir El-Bahari), this is the vast Necropolis of Thebes, the city of dead. Begin with the **Valley of the Kings**, lying protected by the high Gurna Hills surrounding it. Here you will visit the tombs of Egypt's splendid Pharaohs. Deep-cut into the rocky mountainsides are the magnificent tombs of spellbinding construction and decoration.

Then to the **Valley of Queens**, the Necropolis of Ancient Thebes, the city of the dead. The **Valley of the Queens**, gorge in the hills along the western bank of the Nile River in Upper Egypt. It was part of ancient Thebes and served as the burial site of the queens and some royal children of the 19th and 20th dynasties (1292-1075 bc). The queens' necropolis is located about 1.5 miles west of the mortuary temple of Ramses III. Then to the two Singing Statues of King Amenhotep III known as the **Colossi of Memnon** facing the Nile.

Free time for lunch "on your own".

Continue to visit the **Temple of Queen Hatshepsut**, the most significant of Egypt's female rulers. She came to power early in Dynasty 18, at the beginning of the New Kingdom. The Temple is not only a memorial temple that honors Queen Hatshepsut; it is also one of the greatest Egyptian architectural achievements. Designed by Senenmut (Hatshepsut's steward and architect), this mortuary temple closely resembles the classical Greek architecture of 1,000 years later.

Return to hotel and enjoy the remainder of the evening at your leisure.  
Dinner on your own.

Overnight in Luxor.

### **Day 13: CAIRO| Fly to Cairo.**

#### **Meals Included: Breakfast**

Buffet breakfast at hotel.

Check out after breakfast.

Meet your representative at the lobby.

Transfer to Luxor Airport for your domestic flight to Cairo; our representative will help you with all the departure procedures in Luxor & arrival procedures in Cairo.

Upon arrive Cairo airport; you will meet our representative for your private transfer to your hotel for check-in.

Free time for lunch "on your own".
